

FORENSICS: Time-Line MAKE-UP ASSIGNMENT

You may do this by yourself, or with another person making up the assignment.

Using the notes from the website, or from a classmate, construct a timeline using six 8.5" x 11" pieces of paper, taped short-end to short-end.

On each piece of paper:

1. Write the date of the discovery or breakthrough at the top, in about 1-inch numbers.
2. Draw a picture, about the size of your fist, of the milestone discovery – use the internet or a Forensics textbook for guidance on pictures.
3. At the bottom, write the name of the discovery – you do not need to explain it, or write more than a few words.
4. At the end, tape the 6 discoveries short-end to short-end in order of oldest (left) to newest (right).
